The Family Haven is a Company Limited by Guarantee. Registered in England and Wales.
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What we do

The Family Haven provides practical help and emotional support to vulnerable, 'hard to reach' families with pre-school children in Gloucestershire, many living in unsuitable accommodation and in poverty.

We aim to help families to develop the skills and confidence necessary for happier and more independent lives; broaden experiences, introducing fun and relaxation; develop parenting skills; improve physical and mental health; prepare children to benefit from school and reach out to the local community.

We offer:

A welcoming day centre for families every week-day except Bank Holidays, including a registered nursery for pre-school children.

Some of the services we offer include: advice on housing, budgeting and benefits; trips and activities; parenting classes and personal development sessions; good meals and healthy eating programme; laundry facilities; counselling using active listening and a full nursery curriculum.

Our services, based on individual family needs, are confidential, flexible and non-judgemental. We respect families as they are, supporting their development now and for the future.

Whether referred by a Social Worker, Health Visitor or other professional, or recommended by parents who already attend The Family Haven, everyone is offered a one-to-one consultation to ensure they receive the most appropriate services for their family.

Getting Your Event Started

What is happening?

Be unique and be different. Coming up with something unusual will often help to grab publicity and gain attention. However, simple original events often raise the most money.

When is it happening?

Check that other events organised in your area do not clash with yours and also consider school and public holidays.

Where is it happening?

When choosing your venue consider: the size, the catering facilities, access by public transport and its accessibility for those with mobility problems.

Who?

Decide whom your event appeals to and whom you will be inviting. Inviting people who you know will support your event or who have a personal connection to the event.

How?

Try setting up a plan of who is going to do what and by when. How you are going to publicise your event? Could you write a Press Release? How can you raise other funds on the day of your event?

Let people know about it!

You've spent hours buying, training, baking for your event – let people know it's happening! Be loud and be proud, get in touch with the local media, advertise in your local neighbourhood or get online but don't forget one of the best advertising methods is word of mouth. Tell everyone you know and ask them to do the same. These are all free ways in which you can maximise your fundraising potential and get your hard work noticed – More information to help you publicise your event is included under "Publicity"

Let us know about your Fundraising

We like to know what our supporters are doing to raise vital funds for The Family Haven, so we ask that you complete a Fundraising Form and return it to us by post or email. Publicity

Social Media

Promoting your event using social media is a great way of telling the maximum amount of people about your event with the minimum effort. Set up a Facebook event page and invite your friends to share it. Maybe you could get #HAVEN25 trending on Twitter? Remember however, all postings should reflect the ethos and image of The Family Haven; any inappropriate postings regarding your event can be removed.

All forms of publicity must clearly state that you are fundraising “in aid of The Family Haven”.

Keeping Your Fundraising Safe and Legal

Having decided on your fundraising activity, you must ensure that your event is safe and legal.

- ♥ Collections – Public, street or house to house collections (which includes going from business to business) must have a licence. You also need to obtain permission from the owner or manager when a collection takes place on private property.
- ♥ Donations – The person that is collecting donations should be someone that you know and trust. If children are collecting donations, make sure they are supervised at all times.
- ♥ Licences – You will need a licence if you are planning to sell alcoholic drinks or have a street collection. Please check with us or with your local council if you are in any doubt. T: 01452 528691
- ♥ Lotteries and Raffles – Rules change depending on the size of your event. If you hold a raffle at your work place, club or your house there is no need to obtain a licence. For larger raffles please contact your local council/authority to check.
- ♥ Food – To check the rules around food hygiene visit www.food.gov.uk
- ♥ Events – You should conduct a risk assessment to ensure that you have proper plans for the safety of participants.

The Health and Safety Executive has further information (www.hse.gov.uk). Please ensure that participants are fully briefed about the event, including (where relevant) any risks, fitness requirements, special equipment or clothing and standards of behaviour expected.

Ensure that your event is properly and adequately supervised. Where children are included, this includes: providing proper adult supervision, checking the parent/guardians have given their permission for their child to take part. Carrying out appropriate background checks if adults are to have unsupervised access to children.

Consider what insurance cover you need for your event. Check whether you need any special licence e.g. a public entertainment licence or licence to sell alcohol. The Family Haven cannot accept any liability for any accidents or loss of property, so please ensure any fundraising events you hold are safe and legal for everyone taking part.

Gift Aid

Please ask donors/sponsors to sign a Gift Aid Declaration to enable us, and higher rate tax payers, to claim tax back from the Government, increasing the overall benefit to The Family Haven (£1 becomes £1.25). We can provide you with gift aid forms/envelopes.

Collecting the money in...

The main aim of your fundraising is to raise much needed funds to help make a difference to the lives of LOCAL people. There are things you can do to make your fundraising that little bit easier:

Try to collect as much money as possible in advance.

Try to collect outstanding money as soon as possible. If you leave it too long, people may have forgotten and their enthusiasm may have waned.

Don't try to do too much on your own, recruit friends to help you. They may be able to take sponsor forms around to people they know or may even be willing to help with the organisation of your event.

Don't be afraid to ask for sponsors. People are full of surprises and are often willing to contribute to your cause. However, unless you approach them they won't be able to help.

All funds collected should be sent to the charity within 2 weeks of collection.

Expenses must not be deducted from the sums collected unless you have approved this with us and provided us with a receipt.

Paying the money in...
